Using the Study Higher iPads provided, or school computers, students will complete tasks in Gear Up workbooks to research information that is bespoke to their educational or career pathway.

## WHAT'S INVOLVED?

A Gear Up workshop lasts one hour and is delivered at your school for a maximum of 30 students. The one hour session can be repeated throughout the school timetable or be tailored to an individual school event.
