HIGHER EDUCATION?

When you take exams at school or college, you're working towards a qualification at different levels.

-EVEL

Once you've passed your GCSEs (or equivalent qualifications), you'll have completed your Level 1 or Level 2 qualifications.

EQUIVALENT WOULD BE **LEVEL 1 BTECs OR NVQs**

Usually, you work towards level 1 when you're in vear 9 or 10 at school

EQUIVALENT WOULD BE LEVEL 2 BTECs, NVQs, **OR APPRENTICESHIPS**

Usually, you work towards this level when you're in year 10 and 11

FIND OUT MORE

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Once you've completed Level 2 qualifications, you'll need to make a decision about what you want to do next, whether that is to:

- Stay on at school for sixth form
- Go to college

Undertake another form of training

Whatever you pick you will start working towards a Level 3 gualification.

A LEVELS OR ACCESS TO HIGHER EDUCATION COURSES

EQUIVALENT WOULD BE LEVEL 3 **BTECs OR NVQs, ADVANCED APPRENTICESHIPS OR, FROM** SEPT 2020 ONWARDS- T LEVELS.

Usually, you work towards this level when you're 16 or older, and in sixth form, Year 12 and 13 or at college
