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








Qualification Grid

Qualification Definitions

APPRENTICESHIPS

Level 2 qualifications can cover an NVQ, Key Skills and a Technical Certificate. Advanced Apprenticeships offer Level 3 qualifications and can lead to progression to Level 4 Foundation Degree or Degree level study.

A LEVELS

A Levels are **Level 3**courses which you
will complete over two
years. Completing A
Levels usually allows
you to progress on to
a degree course.

BTEC CERTIFICATES AND DIPLOMAS

First Diplomas are broadly equivalent to four/five GCSEs, at grades 9 to 4. National Certificates and Diplomas are broadly equivalent to two or three A Levels and will enable students wishing to progress.

HNC (HIGHER NATIONAL CERTIFICATE)

A HNC is a **Level 4**course which allows
you to progress onto
a HND course. This is
equivalent to the first
year of a degree.

HIGHER APPRENTICESHIPS

These are **Level 4** qualifications, which can progress to Level 6 or 7, and are similar to other apprenticeships. They can give you practical work experience whilst studying academically and earning a salary. To get on to a Higher Apprenticeship you will need to have entry qualifications at Level 3 - such as A Levels, BTEC, NVQ Level 3 or an Advanced Apprenticeship.

DEGREE APPRENTICESHIPS

These provide the opportunity to gain a Level 6 or Level 7 qualification, working in partnership with employers and universities. Degree apprenticeships combine working with studying part-time at a university. Apprentices are employed throughout the programme, and spend part of their time at university and the rest with their employer. This can be on a day-to-day basis or in blocks of time, depending on the programme and requirements of the employer.

NVQs (NATIONAL VOCATIONAL QUALIFICATION)

These are qualifications that are based on the skills and knowledge needed for specific jobs. They usually have a level after the course such as NVQ Level 2 in Administration.

FOUNDATION DEGREES

A Foundation Degree allows you to be in employment and work for a Level 5 qualification. The Foundation Degree allows progression on to a full degree through a top-up course.

HND (HIGHER NATIONAL DIPLOMA)

A HND is a **Level 5** course which allows you to progress onto a degree top-up course. This is equivalent to the second year of a degree.

DEGREE OR UNDERGRADUATE COURSES (BA / BSc etc)

A Degree is a **Level 6**course which allows you to
progress on to postgraduate
courses such as a Masters
(MBA, MSc etc).

PGCE

A Post Graduate Certificate in Education (PGCE) is a year long course that leads to Qualified Teacher Status (QTS).



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
