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# PERSONAL **STATEMENTS**

A personal statement forms part of your application to a higher education course. Different courses and education providers will consider personal statements in different ways. A personal statement could make the difference between you receiving an offer or a rejection. So make sure you give yourself plenty of time to give the best account of yourself.

Here are our top tips for writing a standout personal statement:

#### Be enthusiastic!

Admissions staff will want to understand your motivations behind wanting to study your chosen subject.

#### Show your knowledge

What do you already know about this area of study? Try and demonstrate vour own thinking and ideas.





#### Be reflective

How has your own experience made you want to apply? What skills do you possess that will make you successful on this course?









Highlight your skills and knowledge

– but back up your statements with

demonstrable examples.





#### **Keep it relevant**

You only have 4000 characters and 47 lines for a personal statement; only include information that is relevant to the subject or skills required.

#### Don't plagiarise

Make the personal statement unique to you.

#### Be honest

It's so important that you tell the truth in your personal statement.

## Ready to start writing?

Here are few questions to get you started:

Why are you applying for this course?

What particularly interests you about this subject?

What have you researched or read recently about this subject?

Have you taken part in any additional activities or work experience that highlights your interest in this subject area?

### Remember...

The same personal statement will be sent to all the admissions teams in the institutions you apply to, so make sure it's relevant for everyone who will read it.
