YEAR 11 Progression routes

 Explore different types of progression routes and their entry requirements post-16, as well as alternative progression routes into HE.


YEAR 11 Is HE right for me?

 Explore the academic and social benefits of HE, the economic opportunities and the benefits of HE in terms of personal development and cultural enrichment.


YEAR 11 Money matters

 Explore finance options as a university student and/or apprentice using case study examples. Find out about student finance and additional financial support at HE level.


YEAR 11 Revision skills

 Develop revision techniques and skills.

YEAR 12 Alternate pathways

 Explore alternate progression pathways post-18 including apprenticeships, HNDs, HNCs, HE at further education colleges etc.

YEAR 12 Introduction to UCAS / Personal statements

 Engage effectively with the UCAS process and generate and submit a strong university application.

YEAR 12 Finance your future

 Explore and compare student finance, budgeting support and student employment opportunities as a student and/or apprentice.

The workshops have been tailored to different year groups as a guide. We can be flexible about which year groups receive each workshop.


YEAR 13 HE options and pathways

 Discover HE career benefits and employment opportunities. Find out about research areas, expertise and facilities in HE and new areas of development.


YEAR 13 Is HE right for me?

 Relate interests to university subject areas and degree programmes. Understand economic benefits of higher education and career opportunities for graduates.

YEAR 13 Budgeting and money management

 Explore the costs of university, learn about sources of income as a student including bursaries, scholarships and employment and practice budgeting.

 Develop revision techniques and skills.
