Who is Study Higher and what is 'Young Carers on Tour'

Study Higher is part of a national widening participation partnership called Uni Connect delivering impartial outreach programmes to young people who are underrepresented in higher education. 'Young carers on tour' is our outreach programme for young carers aged 13–18 across Buckinghamshire, Oxfordshire, Berkshire and Swindon. Young people are invited to take part in a number of interesting, interactive opportunities including visits to different universities, informative and interactive workshops and a residential. This project is designed to offer impartial education advice, help young carers harness their future choices, develop and improve life skills, maintain friendships and share an understanding of life as a young carer.

Who has engaged in 'Young Carers on Tour'?

In 2023/24:

54 young carers engaged across

different events.

72% came to two or more events.

Since July 2021 the programme has worked with:

112 young carers.

1/3) of the group have come back for 2+ years.
